SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures general : If exposed or concerned, get medical attention/advice. Show this safety data sheet to the doctor in attendance. Wash contaminated clothing before re-use. Never give anything to an unconscious person.

7.1. Precautions for safe handling

- Precautions for safe handling : Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Use appropriate personal protection equipment (PPE). 8.2. Exposure controls

- Appropriate engineering controls : Ensure adequate ventilation, especially in confined areas.
Personal protective equipment : Gloves. Wear chemical goggles and face shield in combination. Protective clothing.



- Hand protection : Use gloves chemically resistant to this material when prolonged or repeated contact could occur. Gloves should be classified under Standard EN 374 or ASTM F1296. 
